If you come across injured wildlife needing assistance, follow these simple steps:



Check for safety first. To care for wildlife, you first must care for yourself.




Call your local wildlife rescue group for advice and assistance.



Wait near the animal until a wildlife rescuer arrives.

If you must bring wildlife to a vet, here is how you can help keep them safe:



Approach the animal from behind, slowly and calmly.



Cover the whole animal with a blanket or towel.



Have a box ready so you can scoop the towel and animal up together and place in the box.



Once secured, place the box in a safe place in your car - the floor in the passenger seat is good.



Transport the animal to a wildlife friendly veterinarian, or a local wildlife carer as soon as possible.
